THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR. JONATHON

Christ is Risen!

When do we go on the offense? When we feel threatened. When someone angers us. When we feel strongly about something. Jesus goes on the offense in today's gospel, not because he is threatened or angry, but because he feels strongly about the disciples. He cares for them and he wants them to know that he is risen from the dead, has not forsaken them, and wishes to remove any obstacles to their belief in him and following him.

The disciples are locked in, afraid. The risen Jesus appears and removes the obstacles of their disbelief, their concern for their own safety, and their paralysis in response to his crucifixion. He removes these obstacles by bestowing peace upon them, giving them the Spirit, and empowering them to forgive. The disciples see the risen Jesus and are changed – they come to belief.

When we see the risen Jesus, we also are changed – we come to deeper belief. The risen Jesus gives us everything we need to see him and believe in him. We respond to his presence by being willing to change. We move from hardness of heart to forgiveness of those who have hurt us. We move from fear of losing the regard of others to embracing publically Gospel values. We move from aloneness and discouragement to being loving and serving disciples. We reveal that we have seen the risen Jesus, have come to believe more deeply in him, and have changed.

SUMMARY OF THE LISTENING EXERCISES

On our diocesan website, diocesehn.org.uk, you will find all of the summaries from the various listening exercises that have been running in the Diocese since the summer of 2023, along with the results of the Questionnaire for the Dicastery of Bishops Report from March 2023. RIGHT TO LIFE

Ask your MP to support the abortion time limit reduction amendment from 24 weeks to 22 weeks. Research indicates that a significant number of babies born at 22 or 23 weeks can now survive outside the womb, leaving a contradiction in our abortion law. Take action: Let our local MP know that we stand up for the rights of all, from conception to natural death.

2024 YEAR OF PRAYER

This is a Year of Prayer, called by Pope Francis to prepare for the Jubilee Year 2025. He asks that during 2024 we focus on the words of the Our Father, and try to get back to what it really means to pray the Our Father. The banner on the Sanctuary, displaying the words of the Our Father, can help our focus during Mass on this ancient prayer.
