

THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Today is the first Sunday of the new liturgical year, and the first Sunday of Advent. It's important not to view Advent merely as the countdown to Christmas, but as a season in itself. It is a time to prepare for the second coming of the Lord, and to reflect on our own part in God's ongoing work of redemption. The coming of Christ can be understood in three ways – in the past, the present, and the future. As we hear in the penitential rite "Lord Jesus, you came to gather the nations into the peace of God's kingdom... you come in word and sacrament to strengthen us in holiness... you will come in glory with salvation for your people." Those who long for the day when Christ will come again are overlooking his active presence in our lives here and now!

Today's readings do point to his final coming, but also how we should behave in the present. Saint Luke emphasises that we should be vigilant to recognise and welcome the Lord - and that includes recognising him as he comes to us without warning in the ordinary events and people of our daily lives; in the places we least expect. We look at the beauty that is here on earth and in all of creation, and give thanks for the gifts that have been given. Most of all, we can thank our loving Father for sending his Son Jesus to make eternal life possible for all of us. This is really the only gift at Christmas that matters, and we can give no better gift in return than to live in union with Christ. We should use this Advent season of penitence and reconciliation to remove from our lives anything and everything that keeps us apart from him. Our gift to Christ, our Advent prayer, can be found in the simplicity of today's psalm: "Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths, Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour.."

NEW LECTIONARY

The English Standard Version of the Bible is the new translation for our lectionaries and we will begin using it at Masses this weekend. As suspected, it is slightly different to the version we have used for the last 50+ years from the Jerusalem Bible. Our Missalettes will automatically change to the new version of the texts. Sunday Missals from "Hodder and Stoughton" can be bought online or ordered from Pauline Books and Media at St Mary's Cathedral, but full weekday Missals will not be available until at least April next year. All readers at each Mass are asked to check the text on the Lectern before Mass begins, and to read through the scripture passages before Mass begins so they understand the new language and the layout of the new format. Readers are reminded to go to the Sacristy before Mass begins to form the entrance procession.
