# THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Christmas is a time when we think of giving and receiving. At home we wrap up gifts for our loved ones and leave them by the tree, in memory of the greatest gift that we could ever have received, the infant Jesus wrapped in swaddling clothes in the manger. But there are other images from the nativity story of those who gave what they had. Mary gave herself with her great words of acceptance at the annunciation, "let your will be done to me". Joseph gave up his life, pictured so beautifully as he leads his wife on a donkey on the long journey to Bethlehem, protecting and guiding the family entrusted to him by the Lord. The innkeeper gave what little he had available – a stable – so that the couple desperately seeking shelter could have somewhere to bring their child into the world. # **NEWS FROM OUR DIOCESE & THE WIDER CHURCH**

#### THE JUBILEE YEAR - PILGRIMS OF HOPE

The Holy Father has declared 2025 to be a Jubilee Year with the motto and theme "Pilgrims of Hope." It will be a year of pilgrimage and prayer, celebration and reconciliation The Jubilee Year will begin with the opening of the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve, 2024. It is usually the first door to be opened to indicate the beginning of the Holy Year. Later, on 29 December, the Pope will open the Holy Door of the Archbasilica of St John Lateran, the Cathedral of Rome. On the same day, every Cathedral and co-Cathedral throughout the world will have Mass celebrated by the local Bishop to mark the opening of the Jubilee. Bishop Stephen will celebrate the 11.30am Mass at the Cathedral on 29 December to formally commence the Jubilee Year and open the Holy Door. Later on the same day, Bishop Stephen will open the Holy Door at St. Joseph's Hartlepool. "In the course of the year," Pope Francis had written, "every effort should be made to enable the People of God to participate fully in its proclamation of hope in God's grace and in the signs that attest to their efficacy." On 28 December 2025, the Jubilee will end in the particular Churches throughout the world. Finally, the Jubilee Year will formally conclude in Rome on the Solemnity of Epiphany, 6 January 2026.
