
# THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

As we reach Laetare Sunday, half way through Lent, our readings encourage us with great reasons to "Rejoice". The Hebrews celebrate their first Passover in the Promised Land; Paul tells us that Christ has reconciled us to the Father; and the prodigal son is welcomed back home. All invite us to recognise the joy that will be ours if we are wholehearted in our turning to God.

St. Paul tells us that having been transformed by our baptism, we should be instrumental in the transformation of others - exactly what the scribes and Pharisees were not doing. They may have been transformed by their relationship with God but they were doing nothing to help transform others. Blinded by prejudice, they don't see the good that Jesus does in sharing the Gospel message without discrimination. In the eyes of the Pharisees, a sinner cannot change his ways - but the Gospel message is that with God's help anyone can change, and the power of the Gospel lies in love. The theologian Hans Urs Von Balthasar wrote: "The decisive thing is that the sinner has heard of a love that could be, and really is, there for him...". Conversion is not simply a "bad" person becoming "good", but any person experiencing the love of God.

Neither son knew their own father's heart. When the younger son decides to return home, he doesn't know that he will be welcomed back by his father, who is merciful and wants nothing else but his return. The older son is dutiful but distant, like the Pharisees who are obedient to God but without really loving him. Do we find ourselves distant from God because we do not truly know his heart? The father says to the elder son, "everything I have is yours" - our Father constantly opens his arms to us with the same beautiful message: "Everything I have is yours". During the remainder of this season of Lent let's try to get to know our Father's heart better; and may we, who have been forgiven so much, embrace and extend this same love and forgiveness to every person.

And being so far away at the back, they don't know what's happening at the front because they can't see and sometimes can't hear! Please come to the front of the Church, to the seats where your children will be able to see what is going!

# **WELCOMING OUR VISITORS**

A few people have commented recently about how they feel they have not been welcomed 'properly' when attending our churches, or that no-one spoke to them from coming into church to going out. This is difficult because no-one wants to overpower anyone, especially visitors, not everyone wants to have someone talking to them, but at the same time, many people like to be welcomed into Church, either by those who welcome at the door, or by those sitting in the benches. It is important that we make people feel welcome amongst us. So, just a thought .... Do you know who is sitting close to you during Mass ... have you acknowledged them? Have you said 'hello' to them? # LEARNING MORE ABOUT THE FAITH THE VEILING OF CROSSES & STATUES

Once again this year, when you arrive in Church next weekend, you will notice something different. All the Crosses and Statues will be veiled in purple. The practice of veiling images alerts us that something is different, it can be startling at first, but the last two weeks of Lent are a time of immediate preparation for the celebration of the Sacred Triduum. The veils are hard to miss and they serve as a reminder to get ready!

The veiled images build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. The veils seem out of place, and even counterintuitive. It can seem strange that the crucifix is covered up during Passiontide. Through this absence of images, our senses are heightened and we become more aware of what is missing. Similarly, the suppression of the Alleluia during Lent effectively demonstrates that we are in exile from our true Home, where the angels sing Alleluia without ceasing.

When images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we are able to see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His Resurrection.

# **HOLY WEEK MASSES & SERVICES**

#### **PALM SUNDAY**

As we recall the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, our Masses will begin with this special blessing and procession. At the Vigil Mass at St Anthony's this will take place in the presbytery garden at 5.30pm. At the Solemn Mass at St Teresa's this will take place in the Parish Hall at 11.00am. Please do not leave any handbags or valuables in the Church. Solemn Vespers & Benediction will take place at St. Teresa's at 5.00pm.

## **HOLY MONDAY - SPY WEDNESDAY**

As we prepare for the Sacred Tridium we will have keep the same schedule everyday at St. Teresa's. There will be Adoration & Confessions at 5.30pm, followed by Holy Mass at 6.30pm. There will then be a Holy Week Reflection after Mass with Exposition. At 8.00pm we will conclude with Night Prayer.

## **HOLY THURSDAY**

We begin the Sacred Tridium with Tenebrae at St. Teresa's at 9.00am. The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7pm at St Anthony's. After Mass there will be the "Watching", a quiet time remembering the time of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, the Agony and the Arrest; this will end with Night Prayer at 11.45pm.

#### **GOOD FRIDAY**

Good Friday will begin with Morning Prayer at 9.00am at St. Teresa's. This will be followed by Stations of the Cross at 9.30am. The Solemn Liturgy will take place at 3.00pm at St. Anthony's.

#### **HOLY SATURDAY**

Holy Saturday will begin with Morning Prayer at 9.30am at St. Teresa's. This will be followed by Confessions from 10.00am until Midday. The Easter Vigil will be celebrated at St. Anthony's at 8.15pm. Mass will begin with the Blessing of the Fire and the Lighting of the Paschal Candle. This will take place in the Presbytery Garden. The Mass will be much longer than the usual Vigil Mass, but it will be a great celebration of the Resurrection. Please do come along and celebrate this momentous Mass and support those who are coming into the Church.

#### **EASTER SUNDAY**

As we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord there will be Solemn Mass at St Teresa's at 11.00am followed by Tea & Coffee. At 5.00pm we will have Solemn Vespers & Benediction.
