## THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday, the bittersweet beginning of Holy Week. It is a day of fleeting triumph as Jesus enters the great city of Jerusalem. Next Sunday will be another day of triumph - lasting triumph - yet in between is a familiar, sorrowful mixture of pain and dread.

Palm Sunday is the key to understanding the Passion of Jesus Christ, and vice versa. By bringing together two separate, contrasting events in a single liturgy - Christ's adulation when entering Jerusalem, and rejection and death as he is nailed to the cross - the Church confronts us with the Mystery that is Holy Week. We stand with palms in our hands because we want to worship and honour God. We also stand as sinners. It was not just the chief priests and the Roman soldiers; it was our sins that inflicted this suffering on Jesus. We are the reason that he died on the cross. Are we part of the crowd praising Jesus, or are we part of the crowd demanding he be crucified? We are both. Every time we commit sin, we stand with the crowd yelling, "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

"He died for us." Most of us have heard this phrase so many times that we are immune to the fact that Christ died on account of our sins, and the incredible truth that we have been delivered from death. So do not waste this week, but spend it reflecting upon the mystery of his Passion. Let us remember that Jesus died for our sins, your sins, my sins. Be with him at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. The crowd which welcomed Jesus with palms turned against him and abandoned him just as quickly this week, stay to see what we have done to him, and what his Divine love has done for us.

#### WE KEEP IN OUR PRAYERS

We keep in our prayers all those we know who are unwell as well as the many who have no one to pray for them and for those in hospital. We also remember all those who have died recently and for all those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

#### **HOLY PLACES - SECOND COLLECTION**

This weekend, and on Good Friday, the annual collection for the places of the Holy Land will take place. The collection helps the sites in the Holy Land, associated with Jesus, to be maintained. The war in Gaza means very few, if any, pilgrims are visiting the Holy Land at this time. This lack of financial support means that this collection is more important than ever to support the people of the Holy Land in their daily living

#### **LENTEN ALMS**

During Lent we will be supporting several charities, all with a particular focus as Catholic Charities. St Cuthbert's Care is our diocesan Charity and all Lenten Alms collections go towards their work here in the diocese supporting many different things that they do. This year in particular they ask that the financial support that we offer goes towards their Young Stars Fostering Group.

#### **CONFESSIONS BEFORE EASTER - EASTER DUTIES**

Sadly the penitential service that was planned for during Lent has had to be cancelled. However, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available at the following times during Holy Week to allow as many people as possible a chance to go to Confession before Easter.

On Sunday 27th April the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. Therefore, on the afternoon of Sunday 27th April there will be the traditional Divine Mercy Devotions, with the blessing of the image, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Holy Hour and Confessions. This will take place at St. Teresa's, beginning at 2.45pm. Please do spread the word and come along. We will also celebrate the Canonisation of Carlo Acutis, which also takes place on Sunday 27th in Rome.

#### YOUNG ADULT PRAYER GROUP

#### **CHILDREN AT MASS**

When parents take their children to a special event, to a theatre or a football or rugby match, they want their children to have the best seats right at the front. At the front the children can see and hopefully learn to understand what is going on. But when parents bring their children to Mass, they sit with them at the back of church, behind tall and large adults, where there's draughts from the doors, where they can see very little about what is actually happening at Mass and therefore not too sure why they're there! And being so far away at the back, they don't know what's happening at the front because they can't see and sometimes can't hear! Please come to the front of the Church, to the seats where your children will be able to see what is going!

#### WELCOMING OUR VISITORS

A few people have commented recently about how they feel they have not been welcomed 'properly' when attending our churches, or that no-one spoke to them from coming into church to going out. This is difficult because no-one wants to overpower anyone, especially visitors, not everyone wants to have someone talking to them, but at the same time, many people like to be welcomed into Church, either by those who welcome at the door, or by those sitting in the benches. It is important that we make people feel welcome amongst us. So, just a thought .... Do you know who is sitting close to you during Mass ... have you acknowledged them? Have you said 'hello' to them? Be a bit bold and find out who your neighbour is in your pew! And if they are there next week, strike up the conversation again after Mass!

## Holy Week

Today is the beginning of Holy Week, when we specially remember the last days of Jesus and His death on the cross

The Sunday before Jesus died, He came riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. All the people cheered for Him. They laid down their cloaks and palm branches on the road to honour Him. That was Palm Sunday.

On the first Holy Thursday Jesus offered the first Mass ever. He took bread and wine and changed them into His Body and Blood and gave them to His Apostles to eat and drink. The same thing happens at every Mass when the priest says Jesus' words at the Consecration. We don't see the bread or wine change, but they are still really Jesus, offering Himself to God for us.

Good Friday is the day that Jesus died on the cross. The leaders of the Jews got the people to turn against Him. After an unfair trial, Jesus was whipped harshly and made to carry a cross up a hill. Then He was nailed to the cross and hung there until He died. Only His mother and a few of His friends were with Him.

Jesus was God and could have stopped the people from killing Him, but He chose to die for you. Because we sin, we don't deserve to go to Heaven. Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins so that we could go to Heaven. That's why it's called "Good" Friday! What is something special you can do on Good Friday to make up for your sins and say "thank you" to Jesus?

#### **PALM SUNDAY**

As we recall the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, our Masses will begin with this special blessing and procession. At the Vigil Mass at St Anthony's this will take place in the presbytery garden at 5.30pm. At the Solemn Mass at St Teresa's this will take place in the Parish Hall at 11.00am. Please do not leave any handbags or valuables in the Church. Solemn Vespers & Benediction will take place at St. Teresa's at 5.00pm.

#### **HOLY MONDAY - SPY WEDNESDAY**

As we prepare for the Sacred Tridium we will keep the same schedule everyday at St. Teresa's. There will be Adoration & Confessions at 5.30pm, followed by Holy Mass at 6.30pm. There will then be a Holy Week Reflection after Mass with Exposition. At 8.00pm we will conclude with Night Prayer.

#### **HOLY THURSDAY**

We begin the Sacred Tridium with Tenebrae at St. Teresa's at 9.00am. The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7pm at St Anthony's. After Mass there will be the "Watching", a quiet time remembering the time of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, the Agony and the Arrest; this will end with Night Prayer at 11.45pm.

#### **GOOD FRIDAY**

Good Friday will begin with Morning Prayer at 9.00am at St. Teresa's. This will be followed by Stations of the Cross at 9.30am. The Solemn Liturgy will take place at 3.00pm at St. Anthony's.

#### **HOLY SATURDAY**


Holy Saturday will begin with Morning Prayer at 9.00am at St. Teresa's. This will be followed by Confessions from 10.00am until Midday. The Easter Vigil will be celebrated at St. Anthony's at 8.15pm. Mass will begin with the Blessing of the Fire and the Lighting of the Paschal Candle. This will take place in the Presbytery Garden. The Mass will be much longer than the usual Vigil Mass, but it will be a great celebration of the Resurrection. Please do come along and celebrate this momentous Mass and support those who are coming into the Church.

#### **EASTER SUNDAY**

As we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord there will be Solemn Mass at St Teresa's at 11.00am followed by Tea & Coffee. At 5.00pm we will have Solemn Vespers & Benediction.


