# THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Today's Gospel from John continues the "Farewell Discourse" of Jesus. Anticipating the approaching feasts of Ascension and Pentecost, the reading tells both of Jesus' imminent departure, and his promise of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus says to the disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." Incredibly, in his boundless generosity, God wishes to make his home with each of us - individually, on a permanent basis, so that wherever we are God will be at the centre of our lives. We must take care not to hear this as a conditional offer, dependant on us keeping Jesus' word - but rather, it is his love that comes first, which enables us to do the same. When we truly love Jesus, we "keep his word" by trying to be like him in all ways - to live by his words, actions and teaching. This is made possible when the Holy Spirit comes into our hearts, which is why Jesus makes a further promise, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." He reassures his disciples that although he will no longer be physically present, they will not be left uncared for, abandoned. The comfort, assurance and peace he gave his disciples during his lifetime continues in the presence of the Holy Spirit.

This peace is Jesus' farewell gift to his disciples, and to us - "his" peace, a kind of peace the world cannot give. Not just on the surface, not just an absence of problems; it is something deep down which can be there even in times of hardship and suffering; the spiritual serenity and inner certainty that comes from harmony and communion with God - the peace of having God dwelling within us in all our walks through life. We need not be troubled or afraid because truly, we are never alone.

#### WE KEEP IN OUR PRAYERS

#### THE ASCENSION - HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

On Thursday this week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of The Lord. The Ascension is a Holy Day of Obligation, where all Catholics are obliged to attend Holy Mass. Therefore to allow you all the opportunity to fulfil the Obligation to attend Mass there will be two Mass on Thursday. I Oam at St. Anthony's and 6.30pm at St. Teresa's.

#### **NOVENATO THE HOLY SPIRIT**

As we prepare for the great solemnity of Pentecost, we will be praying together the Novena to the Holy Spirit. This will be prayed after all Masses from Friday of this week until Pentecost Sunday. Sheets can be collected from the porch during the week to join in with the Novena.

#### **SUNDAY EVENING VESPERS & BENEDICTION**

Every Sunday at St. Teresa's we have Sung Vespers (Evening Prayer) and Benediction. This time of prayer is such a wonderful opportunity to bring our Sunday to a close, spending time with Jesus in prayer and praise. Please do try and come along if you are able to! It only lasts 40minutes and is such a beautiful service.

#### A DAY OF LIGHT

During lent we held our first 'Night of Light' event, which saw many people come and light a candle before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Our next day will be held on Saturday 31st May between 10am and 12noon. We will be inviting people in off the street to come and light a candle and to say a prayer before Jesus. If you are able to come along and help with this event, please speak to Fr Jonathon this weekend.

## **QUARANT'ORE - 40 HOURS WITH THE LORD**

The parish is currently organising for the traditional Quarant'Ore or 40 Hours. This will take place from Thursday 19th June - Sunday 22nd June. In order to hold this beautiful period of exposition with the Lord we will need volunteers to stay for an hour to pray, while the Blessed Sacrament is exposed. #### **SICK & HOUSEBOUND**



# **LEARNING THE FAITH ACTIVE PARTICIPATION**


The Second Vatican Council's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium, says that "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy" (14). Over the next few weeks it is praiseworthy to think about ways that one might enter more deeply into the liturgy. In this vein, I would like to offer a suggestion that could aid in precisely that.

First, it is helpful to consider what "full active participation of all God's holy people in these liturgical celebrations" (41) actually means and doesn't mean. In our frenetic age, there is a temptation to think that active participation means doing a lot of things. As the then Cardinal Ratzinger wrote in his book *The* Spirit of the Liturgy: "Unfortunately, the word [participation] was very quickly misunderstood to mean something external, entailing a need for general activity, as if as many people as possible, as often as possible, should be visibly engaged in action." But such a reading misses the true point of the council's instructions. According to Ratzinger, "the word 'participation' refers to a principal action in which everyone has a 'part'." In other words, it is not about each person having a separate role but rather every person fully engaging in one and the same liturgical action (according to one's state in life, of course).

Sacrosanctum Concilium itself offers a helpful explanation of what this means: "The Church, therefore, earnestly desires that Christ's faithful when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators; on the contrary, through a good understanding of the rites and prayers they should take part in the sacred action conscious of what they are doing, with devotion and full collaboration". In other words, active participation—while it includes such things as vocalising the responses—is primarily about the intellectual contemplation and heartfelt intentionality of the faithful during the liturgy. It is about actively thinking of what is being said, what it means, and consenting with one's will to the sacred mysteries taking place.
