THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

This weekend we celebrate Trinity Sunday when we remember the great mystery of God being one God in three persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We believe in this mystery because of revelation – what has been revealed to us by God himself through creation and holy scripture, and what has been passed onto us in the Church's tradition, itself inspired by the Holy Spirit. At the end of Mark's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples to go and proclaim the good news and baptise in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. This is our mission as disciples today. Over the coming weeks, we will be offering a chance for those who wish to be baptised, confirmed or received into the Catholic Church, or even those who just want to find out a bit more about the Catholic faith, to journey with us through the RCIA course, which will begin again in September.

This is our opportunity to think about whether we know anyone who would like to become Catholic. Perhaps this is someone who has been thinking about it for a long time, or maybe someone who is just waiting to be asked. As Catholics who believe our faith is the truth, and who have experienced God's love, we should want to share this with those we mix with, in our family, our friends, neighbours or work colleagues. Like the first apostles, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit to have the courage to ask this question and the wisdom to ask it with sensitivity and discernment. We have had the privilege of others sharing their faith with us, whether that is as children as our parents had us baptised, or as adults when others journeyed with us to discover the beauty of the truth we now profess. Let us now seek to do the same.

The RCIA is open to: • Unbaptised adults who are exploring the possibility of becoming Roman Catholics. • Adults baptised into other Christian denominations, who are exploring the possibility of becoming Roman Catholics. • Adult Roman Catholics who have not made their First Holy Communion or received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

If you or someone you know wishes to begin this process then please contact Fr Jonathon for more information. Let us pray for all those who are thinking about this big step in their journey of faith, and let us seek to always be a community that shares the joy of the Gospel with others, and that does not keep this incredible treasure and blessing for ourselves.

40 HOURS OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

The Blessed Trinity

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that tells us that He is three Persons in one God.

Before Jesus came, the people didn't know that God was a Trinity. The Israelites knew that there was only one God, but they didn't know very much about Him. Jesus showed the people that there were three Persons in God when He taught them about Himself and the Father and the Holy Spirit.

The three Persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is one of the Mysteries of our Faith.

What does the Holy Trinity do for us? We know that God the Father made everything and we are intended to go back to Him. The Holy Spirit guides us towards Him, and Jesus is the way.

Every time you make the Sign of the Cross or say the "Glory Be" you are praying to the Blessed Trinity.
