

THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM DAVID PINDER

At the start of our second reading today, St. Paul begins by saying that in his sufferings, he is filling up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions. This bold statement can, at first, appear confusing, since how can anything be lacking in Christ's suffering? The Church teaches us that the sufferings of Christ on the Cross were sufficient for our redemption, there is nothing deficient in the merit of Christ's total self-sacrificial love on the Cross. St. Paul is not disagreeing with this in what he is saying. It is not Christ's sufferings which are insufficient, but rather, what is lacking is our own participation in this work of redemption. Our suffering, when united with the sufferings of Christ, can become both meaningful and fruitful. This is what the Church refers to as 'redemptive suffering', that God can use times of trial to bring grace to others. This can be a source of hope, for whether it be in the face of illness, disappointment, anxiety, uncertainty or doubt, none of these are meaningless, because they become part of Christ's work of redemption.

However, this is not always the easiest of things to do, especially when facing such times of trial ourselves, or when they affect those who we love. Add in to this the changing societal norms, it can be challenging, but for Catholics we have the person of Jesus Christ who is the source and reason for our hope. St. Paul goes on to say how the great mystery of salvation has been revealed to us, "Christ in you, the hope of glory." For us, Christ is not some distant or hidden figure, but rather someone who is present with us, dwelling within us, through the Holy Spirit, and in the great gift of Eucharist, which we encounter every time we participate in the celebration of Holy Mass, or when we adore Him truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Prayer is often the best place to begin, to 'offer up' these times of suffering to the Lord.

The passage ends with a call to action. Paul's mission to proclaim Christ, to teach others, helping them to grow in holiness, becomes our mission too. Our faith is not meant to be something we keep private, but is something to live boldly, making Christ visible in the world. May we follow St. Paul's example, in doing this work 'joyfully' in our daily lives

FUTURE OF SAINT ANTHONY'S

As Fr Jonathon shared with us all last weekend, the Parish council have been discussing the future of our buildings in light of the works that are needed to be carried out. At present St Antony's does not have a functioning heating system in the Church due to its failure in March. In order to repair the heating system we would need to spend in excess of £160,000. This doesn't solve the problem that we have with the damp or include the cost of replacing the Church roof. If repairs are to be carried out on the Church we would need to close the Church for 4-6 months for these to be carried out. With the winter months approaching a decision needs to be made by the whole parish on what we should do. Therefore, an open meeting will take place on Tuesday 2nd September at 7.00pm at St Anthony's. Please do put this in your diary and come along to this important meeting.




