THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

When Jesus tells us, 'Do not be afraid any longer, little flock', he knows just how paralysing fear can be. When we act (or do not act) out of fear, we bow to feelings of insecurity and misperception. These feelings are not of God. Fear is not of God. We know this throughout Hebrew and Christian Scripture, as God command, 'Do not be afraid'. Taking these words to heart, however, can be challenging, as the fears we encounter every day are very real. Jesus is telling us, however, to trust in God during these times of fear.

This message of not fearing continues throughout the Gospel as Jesus addresses in whom or what we place our trust. Jesus says this weekend 'for where your treasure is, there also will your heart be'. This statement is an invitation to reflect upon what it is we truly value and treasure in our lives, for what we value is where we place our hearts. Do we place our hearts in relationships with God and others? Do we place our hearts in gratitude and peace? Do we place our hearts in agapic, self-giving love? Or do we place our hearts elsewhere?

The Gospel this week ends with a sense of urgency, as Jesus reminds us that there will be a time when the Son of Man will come . As we do not know the day or the hour, we must constantly live in relationship with God, practising what we claim to value. This is not fear or cowardice or an act of apprehension. Rather, our constant relationship with God shows trust in what we truly treasure.

FUTURE OF SAINT ANTHONY'S

As Fr Jonathon shared with us, the Parish council have been discussing the future of our buildings in light of the works that are needed to be carried out. At present St Antony's does not have a functioning heating system in the Church due to its failure in March. In order to repair the heating system we would need to spend in excess of £160,000. This doesn't solve the problem that we have with the damp or include the cost of replacing the Church roof. If repairs are to be carried out on the Church we would need to close the Church for 4-6 months for these to be carried out. With the winter months approaching a decision needs to be made by the whole parish on what we should do. Therefore, an open meeting will take place on Tuesday 2nd September at 7.00pm at St Anthony's. Please do put this in your diary and come along to this important meeting.


What is Your Treasure?


